Message from Dr. Wasner Campus Dean, ASPP Chair, Clinical Psychology Programs

Spring is finally here, and along with the warmer weather and increasingly sunny days there is often a sense of renewal and new hope after an often difficult and challenging winter. I hope you can use this time of renewal to further achieve your personal and professional goals in your path to becoming professional psychologists. A little fun along the way is good too.

Summer Registration:

Most of you should have registered for the upcoming summer semester (Summer I May 10 – June 30 & Summer II July 1 - August 21). Summer is usually the semester when we offer the largest amount of electives. In fact this summer we are offering more electives than we have ever before, with 23 special topics and other elective courses in a wide range of topics. We will notify you as soon as we can, if not already, about courses that have too low an enrollment to be viable so you can choose an alternative section or elective.

Several new are courses being offered this summer, which still have openings, include the following Special Topics courses: Neuropsychological Interventions taught by Dr. Tews-Kozlowski; Introduction to Play Therapy, taught by Dr. Julia Robinson, faculty and training director from our CACREP accredited Counseling Program; Psychology and Psychotherapy of Men, taught by Dr. Wasner, Psychotherapy of Women, by Dr. Rastogi and Introduction to Sleep Medicine, taught by Dr. Jamie Lillie. Other special topics course of interest include: Pain Assessment and Treatment; Competency Assessment; Emotion Focused Therapy with Couples; Adult Neuropsychological Assessment; Advanced Psychodynamic Psychotherapy, to just name some. I am extremely pleased to announce that **Dr. Rhonda Goldman**, Associate Professor in Clinical Psychology at the Schaumburg campus has been selected to receive the Carmi Harari Early Career Award by the Society for Humanistic Psychology, Division 32 of the American Psychological Association. This national award is given to an individual for contribution in the areas of inquiry, application, and social action and for outstanding work in the field of humanistic psychology. Dr. Goldman will be presented the award and give an invited address at the 119th annual APA convention in Washington D.C. in August 2011.

Dr. Goldman has been a faculty member at Argosy University, Schaumburg since 1996. Please join me in wishing Evelyn a hearty **CONGRATULATIONS** on her well deserved promotion!!

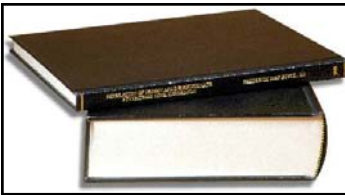

What technical assistance would I typically be able to get?

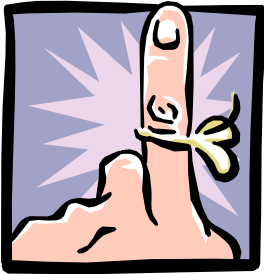

Why do I need to keep copies of my clinical training documents that I turn into clinical training?

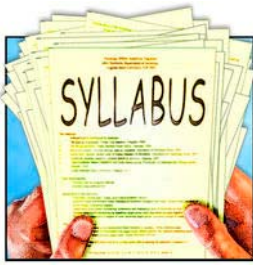

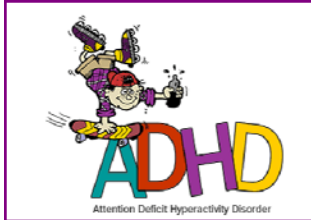

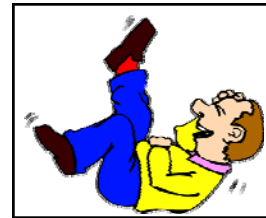
